

CLOSING CEREMONY OF THE PROJECT AND PRESENTATION OF TEACHING RESOURCES ON INNOVATION FOR INCLUSIVE AND SOCIAL ENTREPRENEURSHIP

On 4 April 2025, a conference summarising the implementation of the InnoSocial project took place at the headquarters of the Social Academy of Sciences in Warsaw. The meeting was not only a ceremonial summary of the cooperation to date, but also a presentation of the results. It was attended by academic lecturers, students, trainers, representatives of employers and NGOs, as well as project partners.






For more than two and a half years, experts from universities and educational institutions from Poland, developed Italy, Lithuania and Bulgaria an on international course II&SE (from Inclusive innovation and social entrepreneurship) - inclusive innovation and social entrepreneurship. Before the course was integrated into the educational offerings of the universities involved in the project - SAN (Poland), UNIPV (Italy) and VIKO (Lithuania) - as well as the training institutions Tetra Solutions (Bulgaria) and the inCREA Foundation (Poland), it involved gathering the opinions of stakeholders from different countries at all stages of the project. There were 70 participants in the panel discussions, nearly 40 participants in the "Train the trainer" workshop and almost 90 students participated in the pilot implementation of the course. Training courses using InnoSocial materials were also delivered by trainers from the inCREA foundation in the project "Yesterday excluded, today active", in which 100 people improved their social competences to improve their labour market situation and retraining.

Fourth Transnational Project Meeting in Warsaw, Poland



On 3-4 April 2025, the InnoSocial partners met in Warsaw, Poland, for the fourth international project meeting, hosted by the Social Academy of Sciences. The meeting preceded the final conference and was dedicated to a final review of the physical, financial and qualitative progress of the ongoing project. The final discussion took into account all comments that had been made by numerous stakeholders. The final versions of the project materials developed and used in the pilot implementations were approved. Each partner summarised the work in the packages for which they were responsible. The status of the achievement of quantitative and qualitative indicators was presented, as well as the plan for further activities of the consortium members related to the dissemination of the project, its final settlement and the further development and use of InnoSocial educational materials.



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
